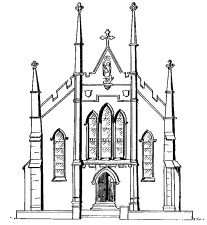

...Jesus, emptied Himself...

Today's second reading from St Paul's Letter to the Philippians contains one of the most beautiful hymns about Jesus in scripture. St Paul begins by telling the Philippians to care for each other; be united in one heart and do nothing out of selfishness. He is also telling us to have the same attitude as Jesus. For God to work through us, we have to take on the humility of Christ and be more concerned with those for whom we are called to care for than with ourselves. When we empty ourselves of our craving for status, or position, or respect, or whatever, then we are like Christ, who humbled Himself. For Christians, empty paradoxically means full; because as we empty ourselves of our self-concerns we find ourselves filling with the grace of Christ. Today's second reading tells us that we have to be like the One who humbled Himself. This is difficult because pride is so deeply rooted in each of us. Through God's grace we can conquer pride. And then we can be the people that God needs us to be for His Kingdom. Christ is the victor, even over our pride.
