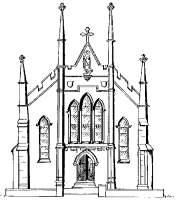
COLUMBANS UK APPEAL 'INVITATION TO MISSION':

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY READINGS:

The other man's grass is not always greener...

Sometimes we imagine that our dreams - if only we could make them happen - will change our lives so much for the better. We think like this because we are affected, albeit unconsciously, by destructive and unwanted influences around us. All of us, to a greater or lesser extent, experience this. Two such unwanted influences are jealousy and selfish ambition; they both hinder us from living our real lives in the present. We can defeat these influences; because we are one with Jesus. He was never jealous of John the Baptist, He never sought glory for Himself even though the people would have made Him king. Jesus wanted nothing more than to care for the least of His Father's children; He identified with the poor and the sick. We can be like Him; we too can live for others simply by being kind and compassionate, rather than wanting to live out our fanciful and unrealistic dreams. Jesus makes our daily lives far better than our dreams can ever do, because each day He reminds us that God loves us as we are.
