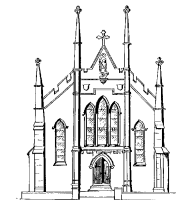

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY READINGS:

What is pure unspoilt religion?

All the blessings and gifts we have come from God. In order that our lives bear fruit, St James says: *You must do what the Word tells you.* We do this by focusing our energies not on ourselves, but on others. The Scribes and Pharisees did not get this right: they focussed on themselves and ignored the needs of others. They saw themselves as beyond criticism simply because they did just as the Law of God required of them. What an easy trap to fall into! We can be caught out by this too. This trap springs when we forget that a life of faith is one that seeks conversion of heart. This is why God has given us the wonderful sacrament of confession; because we all have tendencies to fall away from what is true. The Cross is our symbol; it is a reminder of both the historical gift of Jesus and it is also our call to join Him in living the gift of sacrificial love. In considering the needs of others over our own we leave selfishness behind and begin to live the Love of God.

It is: *coming to the help of orphans and widows.*
