READINGS FOR SIXTH SUNDAY:

A blessing on those...

It is impossible to create an ideal society that does not have God as its foundation, its heart and its goal. The twentieth century began with the most terrible war mankind had ever endured. Millions were killed in the battlefields. They called it the Great War. In 1919, a hundred years ago, the victorious nations gathered in Versailles to formulate a treaty which, they said, would guarantee that the Great War would be the war to end all wars. At the time the treaty was signed, Pope Benedict XV said that the treaty and the peace would not survive because there was no mention anywhere in the treaty about trusting in God. No mention of eternal, spiritual values. The treaty trusted completely in humanity's capability to restore peace to the world. The Pope was proved right because 20 years later the world was engaged in an even worse war, World War II. We need to learn from history that our only true hope must be in God. *Creation without the Creator fades into nothingness* Vatican II tells us in *The Church in the Modern World* (paragraph 36). The perfect society must be united to, and a reflection of, the Perfect One.
